Non-residents pay a \$10 fee for going on Taylor Community trips.

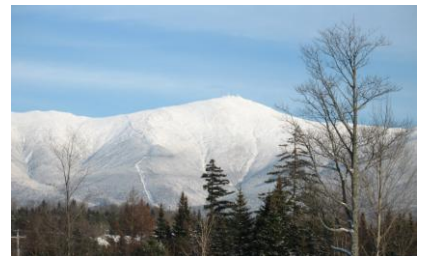
The trips have descriptors – **Easy, Moderate, and Independent** – indicating the degree of mobility [walking, standing, stepping, etc.] required in order to safely participate and enjoy the trip. If a trip requires pre-paid tickets or entry fees, you cannot be reimbursed if you cancel from the trip OR if Taylor needs to cancel the trip due to weather conditions that make driving unsafe.

**Please Note:** All pick-up times are an approximation as circumstances may arise that could alter times by a few minutes.



**Friday – January 8 – Trip to the Currier Museum of Art** [Easy to Moderate – a lot of optional walking in the Museum] The Museum is currently hosting a special exhibit by Maxfield Parrish: *The Power of the Print*. As one of New Hampshire's most well-known artists, Maxfield Parrish was considered by many to be the most popular American artist in the first few decades of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. His popularity was due to the wide dissemination of high-quality color prints of his paintings and illustrations. **The Museum entry fee is \$10.00 to be paid at the ticket office, so please have the exact amount of money with you.** After the tour you will dine at one of the Common Man eateries located in the food court of the Hooksett Rest Area. There will be time to browse in the country store, liquor store or take advantage of the interactive visitor center. **The bus will begin picking up residents on the Laconia campus at 9:45 AM and will make a convenience stop at the Concord Bus Station between 10:30 AM and 10:45 AM.** \*Early Sign-Up: You may sign up now for this trip.

**Friday – January 15 – Winter Mountain Tour with Lunch at Fabyan's Station in Crawford Notch** [Easy] One of the original railroad stations restored and converted to a restaurant and lounge, Fabyan's is located across from Bretton Woods alpine area. The Fabyan's menu includes typical pub menu items, including delicious house-smoked choices as well as soups, salads and other entrees. After lunch we'll drive across Route 302 into North Conway as we head back to Laconia. **The bus will begin picking up residents on the Laconia campus at 10:00 AM.**



**Friday – January 22 – Trip to Warren's Lobster House followed by Shopping at Kittery Trading Post and Stonewall Kitchen** [Easy to Moderate – walking in the Trading Post] Warren's is located on the southern tip of Maine's coast and features great seafood, lobster, steak, chicken and other specialties. After lunch you will have over an hour to shop a vast selection of recreational gear, clothing, footwear and specialty gifts for the entire family. The

last stop will be an approximate 45-minute visit to Stonewall Kitchen. Here you find a variety of specialty foods, cookware and utensils, special treats for the cat, dog or bird in your life, preserves, sauces, dips, crackers and much more. All shopping times are approximations. **The bus will begin picking up residents on the Laconia campus at 9:45 AM. There will be a convenience stop in Alton Bay between 10:30 and 10:45 AM.**



**Wednesday – January 27 – Dining out at the Lakehouse Grille at Church Landing in Meredith** [Easy] Enjoy a view of the lake while dining on the chef's creative New England cuisine, from fresh seafood to hand-cut steaks. Remember to save room for Black-Bottom Crème Brulee or the Chef's daily Bread Pudding to round out your evening. **The bus will begin picking up residents on the Laconia campus at 4:30 PM.**



**Friday – January 29 – Laconia Historical & Museum Society Exhibit: “The Schools of Yesteryear” followed by lunch at the Lyons’ Den in Gilford with a stop at Kellerhaus for dessert** [Easy to Moderate – optional walking at the Laconia Public Library and in Kellerhaus] *The Schools of Yesteryear* exhibit, based on the schools that are no longer operating in the Laconia area, will contain old photographs, treasured items on loan, educational tools used by teachers and memorabilia saved by staff and students. When you dine at the Lyon’s

Den you are made to feel right at home and the food is fresh and delicious. The Executive Chef has over 30 years of culinary experience and Taylor residents receive a 10% discount. When you walk into Kellerhaus you immediately want to head to the ice cream buffet or the room where all the home-made chocolates are available.
