Beware of Durable Medical Equipment Scams

Never give out your Medicare number over the phone or by e-mail. Scammers are looking to send you “free stuff” to which you are “entitled.” If you agree to receive this equipment, which you do not need, such as back braces, knee and leg braces or a ten year supply of catheters, you will receive a box of shoddy equipment which will be hard to send back to the vendor. Your Medicare or your Medicare Advantage provider will be billed and will pay the scammer.

If this happens, pay attention to the Explanation of Benefits (EOB) that you receive from your Medicare provider, and notify them immediately of the claim number and report it as a fraudulent transaction. Medicare is paying billions of dollars for phony claims for this sort of thing and only you can stop the fraud.

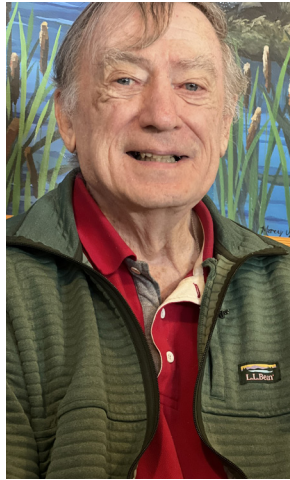

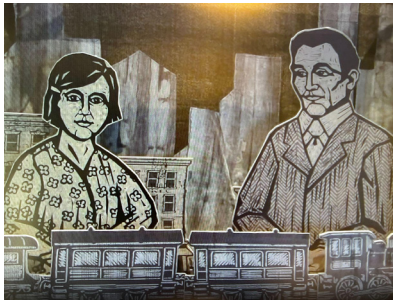

Theatrical Performance - Pontine Theater presents Robert Frost's New Hampshire

Pontine Theatre's Co-Artistic Directors premiere a new work based on the early poems of Robert Frost, a long-time summer resident of Franconia, NH. Frost's first of four Pulitzer Prizes was awarded in 1924 for his volume "New Hampshire: A Poem with Notes and Grace Notes." Known for his New England settings, his down-to-earth, stark depictions of the difficulties of rural farm life and his use of colloquial speech, Robert Frost is widely admired as a true American Master. Harriet Monroe, publisher and editor of "Poetry," wrote that, "perhaps no other poet in our history has put the best of the Yankee spirit into a book so completely." She notes that while Frost's narrative, character-based poems are often dark and satirical, Frost always has a "sympathetic humor" towards his subjects.

Solar Eclipse Viewing Party

Monday, April 8th • 2:15 p.m. | Woodside Pavilion

On April 8th, New Hampshire will be one of only 13 states to experience the totality of the Great North American Solar Eclipse. Experienced astronomers say witnessing a total solar eclipse is one of the most incredible natural phenomena known to man. The eclipse's path of totality crosses New Hampshire's beautiful and remote Great North Woods. But the Lakes Region will be a great location for viewing as well – reaching 97.3% totality. The schedule is as follows: Partial eclipse begins at 2:15 p.m.; Totality begins at 3:26 p.m.; Maximum Totality will occur at 3:29 p.m.; and partial will end at 4:32 p.m. Don't miss out on the opportunity to be part of this once-in-a-lifetime experience. Viewing a total solar eclipse requires specialized glasses to protect your eyes from the sun's light. We have purchased 100 pairs of Eclipse Glasses for this occasion. **Please be sure to make your reservation on Touchtown to reserve your glasses!** Bring a lawn chair. Refreshments will be served.

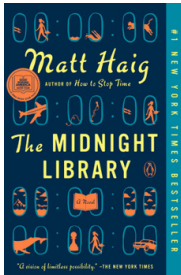

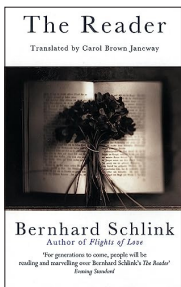

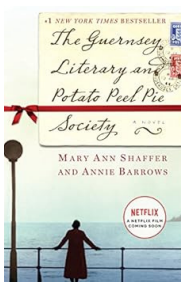
***The Midnight Library*, by Matt Haig**

Between life and death there is a library, and within that library, the shelves go on forever. Every book provides the story of another life you could have lived if you had made other choices. Nora Seed finds herself faced with this decision. Faced with the possibility of changing her life for a new one, following a different career, undoing old breakups, realizing her dreams of becoming a glaciologist, she must search within herself as she travels through the Midnight Library to decide what is truly fulfilling in life, and what makes it worth living in the first place.



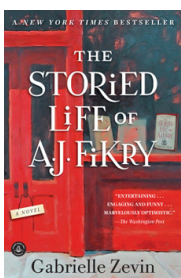
***The Reader*, by Bernhard Schlink**

When he falls ill on his way home from school, fifteen-year-old Michael Berg is rescued by Hanna, a woman twice his age. In time she becomes his lover; then she inexplicably disappears. When Michael next sees her, he is a young law student, and she is on trial for a hideous crime. As he watches her refuse to defend her innocence, Michael gradually realizes that Hanna may be guarding a secret she considers more shameful than murder. Set in the years following World War II, this is the only German novel ever to top The NY Times best-seller list.



***The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society*,
 by Mary Ann Shaffer and Annie Barrows**

Also set in the years after World War II, this epistolary novel begins in London, where Juliet receives a letter from a man she's never met; he has found her name in a used book, and he needs a favor. Juliet is drawn into the world of her correspondent and his friends, members of a book group formed as an alibi when its members were caught breaking the curfew imposed by the Germans occupying Guernsey during the war. Eventually, Juliet travels to Guernsey and becomes witness to events that answer the questions created by the war.



***The Storied Life of A.J. Fikry*, by Gabrielle Zevin**

A. J. Fikry's life is not at all what he expected it to be. His wife has died, his bookstore is experiencing the worst sales in its history, and now his prized possession, a rare collection of Poe poems, has been stolen. Slowly but surely, he is isolating himself from all the people of Alice Island. Even the books in his store have stopped holding pleasure for him. These days, A.J. can only see them as a sign of a world that is changing too rapidly. And then a mysterious package appears at the bookstore. It's a small package, but large in weight. It's that unexpected arrival that gives A. J. Fikry the opportunity to make his life over, and the ability to see everything anew.

Environmental Stewardship Committee - TED TALK - "Microplastics are Everywhere"

We live in a world of plastic. From the clothes we wear, to the electronics we use and the food we buy, our lives are surrounded by, and depend upon, plastic products. Over time, all of these plastic products break down into smaller and smaller pieces to become 'microplastics,' or plastics smaller than five millimeters. As we study microplastics, we are learning that they are everywhere—in the air we breathe, the water we drink and the food we eat. In this talk, we will be led through a day of plastic use, how and where we use and

generate microplastics, and what we can do about it.

TED TALK presenter Sarah Dudas is a biologist at Fisheries and Oceans Canada, a biology professor at Vancouver Island University and an adjunct assistant professor at the University of Victoria. For the last seven years she has led the Ecological Interactions Research Program, working with federal and provincial governments, industry and non-profit organizations to study the effects of human activities on coastal ecosystems. Her research includes investigating marine biodiversity across regional and local scales and the effects of historical and contemporary shellfish farming practices on surrounding ecological communities. Recently, she has focused on the issue of microplastics and their presence in the marine environment and our seafood.

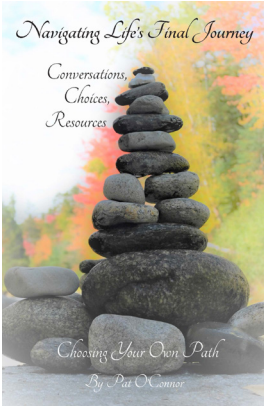
