Updated Visiting Guidelines for Taylor Home and Ledgerview

Effective immediately, visitors coming to our licensed care buildings do not need to make appointments for weekday, or weekend visits. Visiting hours are now 7 days a week with visits beginning at 9am; visitors must arrive before 4pm to be checked in at the Ledgerview symptoms station.

For residents living on the 2nd floor of Ledgerview, weekend outings will need to be scheduled in advance by the end of day Thursday. Please reach out to Dori Cote at dcote@taylorcommunity.org to schedule those outings. Again, the rides and outings for residents on the second floor of Ledgerview need to be scheduled in advance with Dori Cote if they are occurring on a weekend day.

As a reminder, visits must occur within the resident's apartment; visiting in resident common areas will not be permitted.

ALL VISITORS, INCLUDING THOSE VISITING RESIDENTS AT TAYLOR HOME, MUST CHECK IN AT THE LEDGEVIEW BUILDING SYMPTOMS STATION UPON ARRIVAL. The symptom station is located at the first-floor entrance of the Ledgerview building.

Visitors will be given a visitor's pass which they will need to wear throughout duration of their visit.

Independence Day Closures

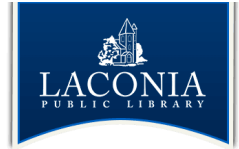
These offices will be closed on Monday, July 5 in observance of the holiday:

Slow Down? Whatever For?!

Woodside Resident Doris Duff, 98, sits atop a camel again in her second trip to Egypt in three years. Doris recently spent 12 days there attending the graduation of her nephew's 18-year-old daughter from the American School in Maadi, a suburb of Cairo. Eight hundred students attend the school, ages 4 through Grade 12.

Do you know, a camel has to change positions seven times to get up from the ground?!!

For the graduation, the school set up staging in Giza by the pyramids. Walking in, "red carpet" (Oriental rugs) spanned 150' to the seating area, adorned on both sides by heaps of beautiful white flowers; the seating and graduation areas were also set with Oriental rugs. Taylor Environmental Stewardship Committee • Composting News

Our new – and larger! – composter has arrived. Thanks to the Taylor crew for setting it up. Last year composting was so successful we didn't have enough room and the composter was overloaded. Perhaps this new one will help reduce this problem.

To make this work, the following will be a big help:

USE THE RIGHT SIDE FIRST. Once it is totally full and is "cooking," then the left side will be opened for use.

What to Compost Now — Green materials for composting consist mostly of wet or recently growing materials. Green materials are usually green or come from plants that were green at some point. These include trimmings from perennial and annual plants, flowers, cuttings, and weeds that haven't set to seed. Also green lawn clippings, leaves, and stems can be used (chop up long woody stems).

Other needed materials and water will be taken care of.

Do NOT put the following in the composter — Meat, bones, dairy products or fish scraps (they attract pests), perennial weeds or diseased plants (you may spread weeds or diseases in your beds when compost is used), pet manures, banana peels, peach peels, and orange rinds (they may contain pesticide or herbicide residues which may be carcinogenic), Black walnut leaves, any plants sprayed with pesticides or herbicides.

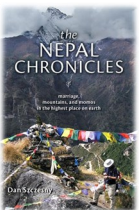

Friday, July 2 – DOCUMENTARY – *Sinatra: All or Nothing* – An up-close and personal examination of the life, music and career of the legendary entertainer. Told in his own words from hours of archived interviews, along with commentary from those closet to him, the documentary weaves the music and images from Sinatra's life together with rarely seen footage of Sinatra's famous 1971 "Retirement Concert" in Los Angeles. The film's narrative is shaped by Sinatra's song choices for that concert, which Gibney interprets as the singer's personal guide through his own life.

Tuesday, July 6 – *Yankee Doodle Dandy* – Brought to the White House to receive a Congressional Gold Medal from President Franklin Delano Roosevelt, Broadway legend George M. Cohan (James Cagney) reflects on his life. Flashbacks trace Cohan's rise, from a childhood performing in his family's vaudeville act to his early days as a struggling Tin Pan Alley songwriter to his overwhelming success as an actor, writer, director, and producer known for patriotic songs like *Yankee Doodle Dandy*, *You're a Grand Old Flag* and *Over There*.



Friday, July 9 – DOCUMENTARY – *Challenger: The Final Flight — Space for Everyone* – The new Space Shuttle program captivates the United States and draws a diverse group of astronauts; however, safety issues crop up out of public view.

Tuesday, July 13 – *Destination Tokyo* – Captain Cassidy (Cary Grant) is in charge of a submarine on a mission so secret even he doesn't know what it is until his ship departs San Francisco, and he opens his sealed orders. His task — to pick up a meteorologist (John Ridgely) and travel to the coast of Japan to gather weather information for the Doolittle Raid, the first air strike on Tokyo. Along the way they fight to elude detection from Japanese ships and eventually face off against an enemy aircraft carrier.



Friday, July 16 – DOCUMENTARY – *Challenger: The Final Flight — Help* – To revive public interest, NASA chooses teacher Christa McAuliffe to be the first civilian on the Shuttle; issues remain with the solid rocket boosters.



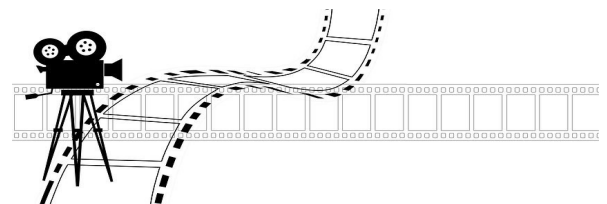
Tuesday, July 20 – *Mister Roberts* – Bittersweet film about a supply officer aboard a decrepit cargo ship during World War II who yearns for a transfer into a combat zone but is thwarted by the ship's captain, a petty tyrant. Forced to endure various humiliations in exchange for privileges, the crew engage in minor acts of resistance, and look to Mr. Roberts for inspiration and moral support. Based on the hit Broadway play.

Friday, July 23 – DOCUMENTARY – *Challenger: The Final Flight — A Major Malfunction* – After delays, the crew prepares for launch as engineers and NASA officials discuss concerns about the O-rings and a cold weather launch.



Tuesday, July 27 – *No Time for Sargeants* – Sergeant King (Myron McCormick) thinks backwoods hillbilly-turned-new recruit Will Stockdale (Andy Griffith) might be the dumbest private ever to join the Air Force. When King puts him permanently in charge of the latrines, Stockdale thinks it's a promotion. Somehow, all King's attempts to make Stockdale look foolish backfire, and one of them even finds the sergeant demoted to private by his superiors. Stockdale, meanwhile, squeaks through training, and soon begins wreaking havoc in the skies.

Friday, July 30 – DOCUMENTARY – *Challenger: The Final Flight — Nothing Ends Here* – Challenger's explosion devastates the families of the crew members as well as the millions of people who watched its live launch; an investigation puts NASA on the defensive.

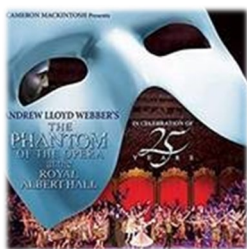

The American Heritage Museum is housed in a 65,000 + square foot building located at the Collings Foundation's headquarters in Stow, MA. The concept began when the Foundation was selected to receive the massive collection of tanks, armored vehicles and military artifacts from the family of Jacques M. Littlefield in 2013.

Receiving this historically important and extensive collection was a tremendous honor for the Collings Foundation, and exhibiting these artifacts in the most meaningful way possible is their goal. They designed the Museum to fully engage people in understanding our turbulent past. In this remarkable place, American history will be explored, studied and most of all, remembered. Through educational interpretation, and a chronologically arranged series of dioramas and exhibits, they bring the history of our veterans to life.

Among the staggering variety of rare relics, the Museum features over fifteen tanks and artifacts that are the only ones on public display in North America. These include: M1A1 Abrams Tank, T-34 Tank, Kommandogerratt 38 German Rangefinder, Leichter Panzerspähwagen SdKfz 222 Armored Vehicle, Matilda MK.II Tank, Jumbo Sherman Tank, IS-2 Tank, Panzer 1 Tank, SCUD Missile and Launcher, Ho-Ro Tank and many more.
